

Peran dives in at Rebecca Adlington Swim Centre

With the government promoting healthier lifestyles and London 2012 fast approaching; many local councils are enhancing their leisure facilities to appeal to people of all ages and abilities.

Mansfield District Council led the way with a major £5m redevelopment and huge extension of their Swim Centre. Named after their own double gold medal winning athlete 'Rebecca Adlington', the finished result needed to reflect the olympic standards to live up to its name.

Flowcrete dived in to refurbish and extend the existing leisure centre with innovative ideas to transform the Swim Centre. Firstly new screeds were laid in the pool surrounds, changing rooms and corridors. The products were laid with falls to ensure good drainage and EP flex was used as a base over existing tiles forming a robust platform on which the Peran STB floor finish could be installed.

Laid over underfloor heating, the Heavy Duty K-Screed together with Peran STB not only satisfied the latest health and safety regulations but also formed an excellent thermal conductor allowing the heat to radiate efficiently delivering a consistent ambient temperature throughout and reducing energy costs.

The fantastic results met all the architects requirements of a seamless, hygienic, attractive finish with lots of drainage at the pool perimeter and encased fully in resin to maintain the existing details. Stencilling for DDA and disabled access added the final touches to these ultimate fitness facilities which opened for business in January 2010.
