FeRFA CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM FOR FLOOR TYPES

FeRFA developed an easy to understand classification system for the different types of resin flooring (graded from 1 to 8). This system has been adopted by the BSI for their Code of Practice BS 8204-6: Screeds, bases and in situ floorings: Synthetic resin flooring.
