BUILD UK ACCIDENT SURVEY 2016 - LIVE NOW

The 2015/16 BUILD UK Accident Survey is now live for FeRFA CONTRACTOR MEMBERS to submit accident statistics for the last 12 months from 1 April 2015 – 31 March 2016 via the following link:

The deadline for responses to this year's survey is **Friday 29 July 2016** - but please don't wait until the deadline to complete it as we will send regular reminders until it is completed. It should only take a few minutes to do, and if you have had no reportable accidents it will be just seconds as all you need to give is number of employees for that period, then click NO to accidents and it is done.



Please note that providing annual accident statistics is a requirement of membership for contractors.

A good response to the survey is vital as the information can be used to demonstrate to clients and others that the safety record of members is better than non-members. It can also help to identify accident trends in order to produce guidance which can reduce the risk of similar incidents in future.

PERFECT FINISH

Starting with the essential techniques of correct floor preparation and through a combination of classroom teaching and practical experience, the trainees learnt the various methods of surface preparation and the choice of equipment available.

SCREEDING APPRENTICES CONTINUE WITH THEIR PRACTICAL MODULES



The second specialist screed training module took place this month at the The Preparation Group's excellent training facility in Lincoln.

Following a day of classroom theory from industry expert Andy Vincent of Tekfloor, the apprentices on this scheme had the opportunity to mix, pump and lay a calcium sulphate screed under the professional tuition of Andrew Hill of PFT Central.

The two-year specialist apprenticeship scheme has been developed to meet the specific requirements of the screeding sector and this module was supported by Tekfloor, Frances Flowers and Anhydritec with the provision of materials and technical guidance.

The apprentices will take their next modules at Instarmac in September.

FeRFA's RECYCLING SCHEME


RECYCLING - ARE YOU TAKING PART?

We have the data for the first four months of 2016 and already more waste has been diverted from landfill than in the whole of 2012. This demonstrates just how successful the recycling programme is and the commitment of FeRFA members on this.

The way we gather data from members has been simplified. We now require two figures per month - total weight collected and total weight recycled or recovered. <u>An easy to use template can be downloaded from the Recycling Section within the FeRFA Members Area.</u> Only those companies that provide waste statistics will be able to display the recycling logo alongside their company entry on the FeRFA website. (If you use <u>Reconomy</u> as your waste provider, you do not have to provide separate statistics.)

If you are a manufacturer, FeRFA Recycling partner, <u>Protech Plastics Containers</u> can supply containers in various sizes to suit your product range, which are now produced from **40% recycled material**. Call Protech on 01827 314615.


